## REMOVAL OF DISCOUNTED RATES OF SALARY

(Matter No. 13 of 2014)

- [1] This statement concerns an application by the Australian Defence Force (ADF)<sup>i</sup> to amend DFRT Determination 15 of 2008, *Salaries* by the removal of Clause B.2.6<sup>ii</sup>, and the repeal of Part 3 of Schedule B.3<sup>iii</sup> of the determination with a date of effect of 9 April 2015.
- [2] This matter was considered in a hearing on 2 December 2014. Mr R. Kenzie AM QC appeared for the ADF and Mr J. O'Reilly for the Commonwealth.
- [3] The ADF seeks to finalise a process to transition all Army Reserve officers who are currently being remunerated under the provisions of discounted daily salary rates, to that of the non-discounted daily salary rates. The Commonwealth supports the ADF submission noting "recent changes which focus on the deployability of Army Reserve members to deliver defined levels of capability"
- [4] ADF Reserve Officer pay placements were last considered by the DFRT in Matter 3 of 2006 as part of the *Reserve Remuneration Review* and, at the time, the daily pay rates were based on ab initio part time reservists without prior military experience.
- [5] We considered the evidence before us that the Army is now aligning its Regular and Reserve structures<sup>v</sup> and that Plan BEERSHEBA<sup>vi</sup> will result in significant changes to the roles of Reserve personnel and the force structure.
- [6] We considered evidence provided both in this submission<sup>vii</sup>, and in previous briefings<sup>viii</sup>, that Plan SUAKIN<sup>ix</sup> will result in changes to the employment patterns of Reserve units and provide greater interoperability of Reserves with the Permanent Force.
- [7] We accept that the Army remains the only Service in the ADF using the discounted rates of salary and that no officer will be disadvantaged by the changes.

- [8] We note that all officers currently remunerated under the provisions of the discounted rates of salary will be transferred to the corresponding non-discounted daily salary rate and that any subsequent advancement in pay will be in accordance with the Graded Officer Pay Scheme.
- [9] A determination will shortly be issued giving effect to our decision.
